His works include Boston's Central Wharf Plaza, the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts in Kansas City, and the newly completed Clark Art Institute in Williamstown, Massachusetts. Eric received a Master of Landscape Architecture from the Harvard Graduate School of Design, where he received the Charles Eliot Fellowship, and graduated from Amherst College, where he was honored as a Thomas J. Watson Fellow.
