- A. Graduate Faculty Summit 'Best Practices & New Programs at URI' (DeBoef)

 Tuesday, March 24, 2020 at the Multicultural Student Services Center Hardge Forum
 - 1. Bringing in an outside speaker that has been involved in bringing in new innovative programs.
- B. Call for nominations made through InfoReady:
 - Excellence in Doctoral Research, Excellence in Master's Thesis Research, and Excellence in Graduate Mentoring
 - Dean's Fellowship, Dean's Diversity Fellowship, and Tuition Scholarship

IV. New Business

- A. Appeals Board (Zawia)
 - A Graduate Student Academic Appeals Board will need to be convened and members nominated.
 - 2. Create a Board of 5 members.
 - a) GSA nominates two students and one faculty member.

- b) The Graduate Council nominates two tenured faculty members.
- 3. Jessica can coordinate meetings and administrative duties.
- 4. Two appeal cases, one from the College of Business and the other from Chemical Engineering.

- B. Micro Credentials Policy (Mosley-Austin)
 - 1. New appendix to Graduate manual would provide a framework for non-credit bearing co-curricular micro-credentials that can be awarded as digital badges.
 - The Diversity and Inclusion Badge Program (DIBP) is in its fifth semester and has worked with ITS and Publications to make a process for awarding these badges digitally. DIBP will be using 'Badgr' to award the badges.
 - a) Students can place this credential on their LinkedIn or on their websites. It will provide a link for employers or anyone else interested to click and get more information about what they had to complete, what the program objectives were, and what experiences they had to meet for this credential.
 - 3. Recommendation to make minor edits:
 - a) Add clear graduate level specific language throughout appendix.
 - b) Within section 3.0, reword assessment language.
 - c) Add matriculated specific language.

- A. Admissions requirements for online certificates for international students residing abroad (Mosley-Austin)
 - The URI online group has many proposals and one approved program for a certificate that they
 would like to be available to International students. They will only enroll International students in
 certificates, without being in a degree program, if they're part of a program where there is a
 designated partner in the country of where the students will be in Residence.
 - 2. Any online certificate would be offered to International students when there are defined Partnerships such that the university would have a license and all permissions legal necessary to award an academic credential in that country.
 - Request to remove the sentence that prevents International students from obtaining an online certificate. International students must be enrolled in a graduate degree program. The reason why that sentence is there is because students can't get a visa to come to the US only to complete a certificate.
