What is The Science and Math Investigative Learning Experiences (SMILE) Program?

An after school STEM club of about 20 students and 2 teacher leaders that meets weekly for 1.5 to 2 hours for 32 weeks.

What are the goals of The SMILE Program?

- 1. To provide and integrate STEM real world experiences, mentoring, hands-on activities, and career explorations to support students.
- **2.** To increase students' interest in STEM areas through hands-on activities, annual events mentored by URI college students, and field trips.
- **3.** To encourage students to do well academically, graduate high school well prepared to go to college/ higher education and pursue STEM careers.
 - **Students who are in SMILE for 3 or more years, participate in Family Science Nights and Annual Events, are eligible for a \$500 college scholarship.
