REQUIREMENTS for a BA in ART (Bachelor of Arts)

Proposed revision April 2013

A total of 120 credits is required for graduation. Students must fulfill the requirements of the Basic Liberal Studies program (Gen-Ed). In addition, 42 credits must be taken at the 300-level or above. These can be classes within the Art Major or elective classes. See the URI Catalog for details: http://web.uri.edu/catalog/

The BA ART Major requires a minimum of 36 credits and allows a maximum of 51 credits. These must be taken in the following areas:

9 credits of Foundation Studio Courses

- ART 101: Two-Dimensional Studio (3)
- ART 103: Three-Dimensional Studio (3)
- ART 207: Drawing I (3)

6 credits of Introductory Art History

- ARH 251: Introduction to Art History Ancient to Medieval (3)
- ARH 252: Introduction to Art History Renaissance to Modern (3)

6 credits selected from one of the following sequences of studio courses. (*This sequence must be completed by the end of the Junior Year.*)

- ART 204 & 304: Digital Art and Design I & II
- ART 213 & 314: Photography I & II
- ART 215 & 316: Video and Filmmaking I & II
- ART 221 & 322: Painting I & II
- ART 231 & 332: Printmaking I & II
- ART 233 & 334: Relief Print and Typography I & II
- ART 243 & 344: Sculpture I & II

3 additional credits of ART at the 200 or 300 level

6 additional credits of ART at the 300 level (except 301)

• ART 405 (Senior Seminar) may be used to fill this requirement with permission of the instructor.

6 additional credits of Art History at the 300 level or above.

• At least three of these credits must be selected from the following Modern art history courses: ARH 331, 361, 362, 364, 374, 375, 376, 377, or 480 (when taught with a Modern topic as approved by chair).

NOTES

- 1. Students must participate in ART 002, Sophomore Review, in the first semester of their sophomore year (see below for more details).
- 2. Many majors choose to do an internship in their junior or senior year. ART 300 Art Gallery Internship or ART 307 Art Internship. Consult with your advisor about how to set up an internship

at an art gallery, design company, photography studio, or other appropriate business or organization.

SOPHOMORE REVIEW: ART 002 (no credit)

Sophomore Review is a special evaluation set up to provide individual studio art majors with timely feedback from the art department faculty once they have completed the foundation courses (ART 101, 103, 207) and are ready to take more advanced and specialized studio subjects. Eligible students are Sophomore or Junior Art majors (BA or BFA) who have completed ART 101, 103, and 207 with at least a 2.3 GPA in those classes.

Eligible students should:

- 1. Register for ART 002 in the first semester possible (URI Freshmen may register in the Spring semester for the Fall Sophomore Review).
- 2. Prepare a portfolio of 15 of their best works from the Foundation courses. Generally, students should submit the actual drawings, photographs, collages, paintings, or objects made in foundation courses, but in some cases, photographic documentation of three-dimensional works or other unwieldy projects can be submitted. Check with your advisor. Five additional works done in other studio classes may be added, but no more than 20 pieces will be accepted.
- 3. Fill out the Statement of Purpose Form, available in the Art Department Office and on the department's web site at: http://www.uri.edu/****. This form includes questions about students' current artistic goals and interests, as well as their own assessments of their strengths and weaknesses.
