ELIGIBILITY & COST FOR HEALTH SERVICES CARE

All full-time students, and all international students and their spouses are required to pay the Health Services fee.¹ Part-time students may elect to pay the health fee. The Health Services fee for academic year 2013-2014 will be \$246 per semester. Every full-time and international student is required to have health insurance. The Accident/Sickness Insurance charge is automatically assessed to your tuition bill and may be waived with proof of comparable insurance by visiting www.health.uri.edu.

FACILITY

Health Services is located in the Potter Building on Butterfield Road. We are in close proximity to the Dining and Residence Halls. During the academic year, we are open for clinical services Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. and on Saturday, Sunday and most holidays from 12 to 4 p.m. for accident and illness care and health prevention and wellness.

Health Education programs are also located at the Potter Building. Community health education and health promotion activities, student internships, and volunteer programs are conducted by the staff.

SERVICES

The following services are available to all students and their spouses who have paid the health fee:

General Medical Services	Physicians, nurse practitioners, and registered nurses see patients by appointments or in emergencies. Clinical hours are 9 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 12 to 4 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, excluding winter and spring break. Other services include Women's Clinic (STI testing, family planning, and routine GYN exams).
Specialist Services	Part-time physicians offer clinics in a variety of medical specialties, including Dermatology, General Surgery, Gynecology, Internal Medicine, and Psychiatry. (Subject to availability of specialist).
Ancillary Services	A licensed pharmacy, ² clinical laboratory, and X-Ray departments are available. Other services include: eye screening, EKG services, allergy, wart, immunizations, HIV testing; Health Education programs, alcohol and substance abuse education, ³ counseling services, nutrition services, wellness checks, and many other programs in preventive care.
Support Services	A full complement of qualified professional staff including Health Information Management, Business, Insurance, and clerical aspects of Health Services. An Electronic Health Record (EHR) system affords a vast array of data, both administrative and clinical.
Academic Services	Many inter-relationships exist with academic programs, both on campus and with other universities. Relationships have been established with several residency programs of the Brown Medical School. U.R.I. Pharmacy Interns, Nursing, Clinical Laboratory Science, Microbiology, Kinesiology, Physical Education, Health Studies, Counseling Services, Nutrition Counselor Education, Psychology, Community Planning, and Business Administration have affiliations with Health Services.
Counseling Services	Separate from Health Services, the Counseling Center is located in Roosevelt Hall. Hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. while classes are in session. Telephone: 874-2288.
