The most important task facing the Faculty Senate Executive Committee in the next year will be to facilitate the work of the new Faculty Senate committees. I am interested in this task because in the summer of 2017 I was a member of the ad hoc committee known as "Ka-boom." We drafted language describing the new committees for the University Manual and the Faculty Senate By-Laws. I have served twice before on the Faculty Senate Executive Committee, the last time being from 2009 to 2012. I have been a member and sometimes the chair of many standing and ad hoc committees of the Senate. For example, I have chaired the Curricular Affairs Committee and the University College and General Education Committee. My most significant recent service was as a member of the General Education Implementation Steering Team (GEIST) from 2014 to 2016. In addition to my university-wide service I have served my department and college in various capacities. I chaired the History Department for six years

and I have served as Interim Chair on three other occasions. I am currently my department's Director of Undergraduate Studies. I chaired the College of Arts and Sciences Curriculum Committee from 2014 to 2017.

I have been a faculty member at URI since 1987 in the Department of Psychology. Since coming to URI, I served for 12 years as Director of the doctoral program in Clinical Psychology, then four years as Chair of Psychology, and most recently, six years as Associate Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. My research is in the areas of Gender, Sexuality, and Women's Health and I have successfully graduated 21 doctoral students. I have participated in substantial university service including as Co-Chair of the Equity Council and as a member of the Gateway to Completion Steering Committee, the Student Success Committee, the Complete College America URI Task Force, the Strategic Budget and Planning Committee, the Academic Affairs Diversity Task Force, and the Academic Advising Joint Steering Committee. As Associate Dean of Arts and Sciences, I focused on enhancing experiential learning in the college and coordinated the Arts and Sciences committees on Assessment; Diversity; and

Research, Scholarship, and Creative Work. I previously served two terms on the Faculty Senate. My current interests at the university level are in enhancing student success, developing strong degree programs, and improving opportunities for faculty productivity in both scholarship and teaching. I see the Faculty Senate Executive Committee as a great opportunity to work toward these goals.
