Revised General Education Program (2001)

The University College and General Education Committee considered the following matters at their meeting of November 6, 2003. They are now presented to the Faculty Senate for confirmation.

I. English Communication: Writing Core Area (ECw)

The UCGE Committee recommends that the Faculty Senate approve the following courses for the ECw) area of the revised General Education Program (2001), including the assignment of the Diversity designation:

WRT 104 Writing to Inform and Explain (*reading complex texts, writing effectively, using information technology*)

WRT 106 Writing from Field, Print and Electronic Sources (*using qualitative data, writing effectively, using information technology*)

WRT 235 Writing in Electronic Environments (*speaking effectively, using artistic expression, writing effectively, using information technology*)

WRT 303 Public Writing (*speaking effectively, reading complex texts, writing effectively*)

WRT 305 Travel Writing (*examining human differences, reading complex texts, writing effectively*) Diversity
